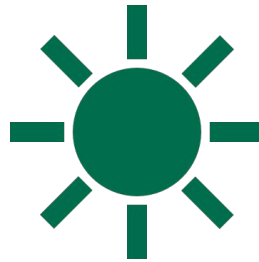

Climate Bond (Prop 4) includes SNC for:



\$33.5M for wildfire
resilience projects



\$48M for nature-based
solutions/climate
resilience



Pending legislative approval:
\$40M for collaborative,
regional (landscape-scale)
projects

Resilience: More than Pace & Scale

OPEN NOW: Sustainable Recreation, Tourism, and Equitable Outdoor Access Directed Grant Program



- \$4.1M remaining Prop 68 funding
- Projects that enhance, promote, and develop sustainable recreation and tourism
- Max award: \$500,000
- Concept proposals due December 1, 2025
- Final recommendations will go to Board June 2026

OPEN NOW: Wildfire and Forest Resilience Directed Grant Program

- Protecting people & communities
- Shovel-ready projects - environmental compliance complete or approved for EPP
- Work to be complete within 2 years (Jan 2030 at the latest)
- \$10 million available – funded by Prop 4
- Proposals accepted on a rolling basis until Jan 1, 2026

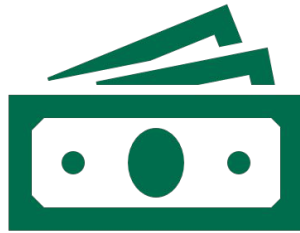

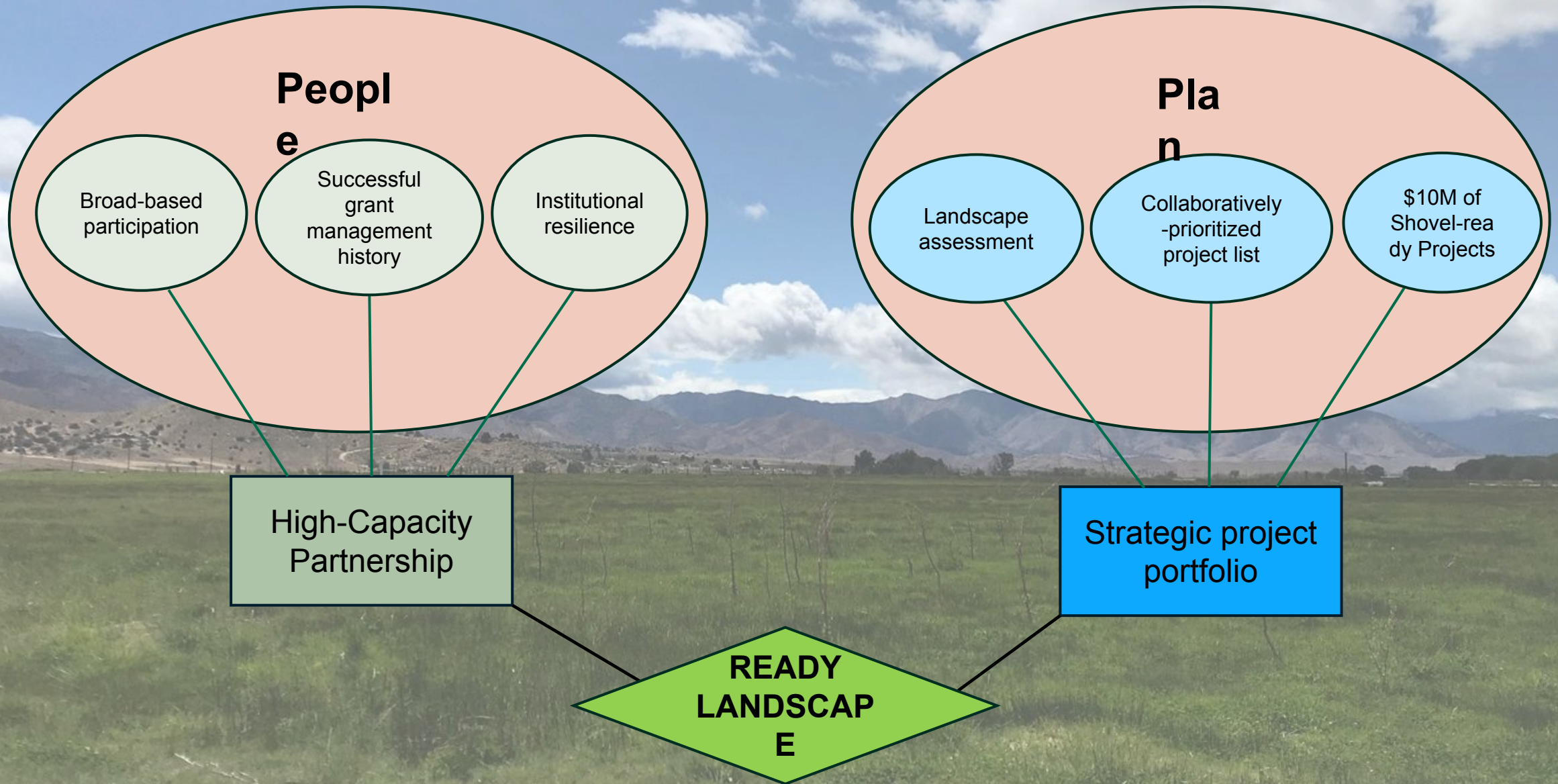
